**Narrative**

2. The envelope was addressed to the [REDACTED] House via the [REDACTED]. The return information on the envelope was [REDACTED] and had a drawing after [REDACTED]. The envelope contained several playing cards with John F. Kennedy's likeness, stamps, a cutout bracelet, several handmade drawings on a paper, a Sports Illustrated picture of Kate Upton in a bikini affixed to a card, and a note. The note read, "I feel the hurt you must be going thru. Ive lost too many too. Love & Peace will come - But till then just know..." The note was signed [REDACTED].
3. Nobody at that sorority house knew who the sender was, nor was anyone expecting a letter of that nature.
4. Detective Heinle photographed the envelope and its contents. The letter was taken and immediately submitted to Moscow Police Department evidence for DNA testing. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] said the mail had been sorted and was given to them by [REDACTED] who is a [REDACTED] at University of Idaho. I contacted [REDACTED] who told me he received it from the [REDACTED] on December 5, 2022, between 1230 and 1300 hours.
5. After conferring with ISP Sergeant Mike VanLeuven, I re-contacted [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to collect DNA samples for rule-out purposes since they opened and handled the letter. At 1547 hours, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] returned. I collected buccal swab samples from each of them and submitted the samples to Moscow Police Department Evidence the same day for DNA testing.
